

Collecting

First, we made collections of "beautiful stuff" materials – found and recycled things. Children could take as many things as they wanted for their collection.

Next we said "Now you can make a picture with your collection. You can arrange the beautiful things however you like." The children described their creations and we wrote down their words.




Arya: It's my school. Blossoming Cherries Center. I put the things. I need to put the biggest ever. The buttons! And there – the last button.

Chenny: 3. 4. 9


